Nomination guidelines for the Anne-Marie Muscat Compassion Award

1. The award is presented annually at the St John NT AGM, held in November each year.
2. St John Ambulance will present \$500.00 to the winner's charity of choice.
3. Anne-Marie's family will present a perpetual trophy and an engraved plaque/trophy for the individual to keep.
4. The person being nominated must be a current St John Ambulance NT employee.
5. The nomination must be received on the official nomination form – a copy of which is attached to the guidelines.
6. Nominations will be accepted up to two weeks prior to the AGM each year.
7. Nominations are to be sent via email to rhiannon.wilson@stjohnnt.asn.au or forwarded to Rhiannon Wilson at the Casuarina Centre.
8. The Award is designed to compliment existing St John awards such as the Paramedic of the Year Awards.

When submitting a nomination form, please consider the following points (which are the same requirements that the judging will be based upon):

- The recipient has displayed compassion towards their peers, members of the public, other co-workers or members of affiliated health services.
- Commitment to the St John organisation as a whole with examples of support to specific areas.
- An overt, happy and positive disposition.
- The ability to look at both sides of an argument and be objective
- The nominee has committed a selfless act to help someone in need.
- The nominee has shown kindness and consideration to those less fortunate than themselves.
- Psychological support/mentoring of co-workers/patients, showing commitment to the progression of health services above and beyond what is expected as their normal role.

Background:

The Award was created in memory of Anne-Marie Muscat, a well known member of St John Ambulance for over a decade. During her time with St John, Anne-Marie held a number of positions from First Aid Kit Restockist to on-road Paramedic and Staff Liaison Officer.

Anne-Marie was respected throughout the organisation and admired by all who were fortunate to have made her acquaintance.

Anne-Marie was a gentle, kind and caring person, with a warm and friendly nature, who always had time to lend an ear to anyone in need. During her time as a Paramedic her bedside manner and compassion for her patients was second to none. She also had an amazing ability to put anyone at ease with empathy and reassuring conversation.
