OCCUPATIONAL FIRST AID

Do you work with heavy machinery or in a high-risk work environment? A higher first aid qualification may be required to ensure your staff and employees are protected against potential dangers.

This course equips students for emergencies in a high-risk work environment and provides the skills necessary to be responsible for a first aid room.

COURSE DURATION

St John offers the following options:

1. 3.5–4 days. The duration varies by State/Territory to include local requirements. Students that have completed HLTAID003 Provide First Aid within the previous 12 months may request an exemption from day one of the course.
2. 2 days. Students complete an e-learning module, and 2 days of practice and assessment. This course is for those who are confident in their skills and are experienced first aiders and people who complete their training regularly.

CERTIFICATE

On successful completion of this course you will be issued a statement of attainment in:

- HLTSS00027 Occupational first aid skill set, which consists of the following units of competency:
 - HLTAID006 Provide advanced first aid
 - HLTAID007 Provide advanced resuscitation
 - HLTAID008 Manage first aid services and resources

Most workplaces require a specific number of people to successfully complete this qualification. St John recommends, as per the *First Aid in the Workplace Code of Practice* and the Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines, that first aid skills are renewed every 3 years, and resuscitation skills (HLTAID007) are renewed every 12 months.

- Lifting and moving of a casualty
- Head, neck and spinal injuries including collars and spine board
- Clinical assessment in detail
- Childbirth (overview)
- Basic anatomy of all body systems
- Triage
- Casualties who are emotionally disturbed and under the influence of drugs and alcohol
- Risk assessment
- Managing all aspects of a First Aid Room
- Post incident management
- First aid in the context of the workplace
- Documenting a response to a major incident
- Evaluating provision of First Aid



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ASSESSMENT METHODS

A successful outcome for this statement of attainment will be determined by a range of different assessment methods including written assessment, observation of simulated and practical activities etc.

You will be required to demonstrate CPR on a manikin on the floor.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS/PREREQUISITES

There are no entry requirements or prerequisites to undertake this training.
