

Remote Area First Aid

3 days with pre-work (2 days if Provide First Aid completed in previous 12 months)



This remote area first aid course is specifically designed to meet the first aid needs of bushwalkers, wilderness guides, and people who work or live in remote locations. The course covers everything from comprehensive first aid treatments to aeromedical evacuation, long-term care, self-care and contingency planning. This course is focused on the safety of the first aider and extended care of an ill or injured casualty where help is likely to be delayed or inaccessible.

Certificate:

On successful completion of this course you will be issued a Certificate which is a statement of attainment in:

- HLTAID001 Provide CPR
- HLTAID002 basic emergency life support
- HLTAID003 Provide first aid
- HLTAID005 Provide first aid in remote situations

St John recommends, in line with Australian Resuscitation Council guidelines and Safework Australia's First Aid in the Workplace Code of Practice, recommend that first aid skills are renewed at least three years and CPR skills are renewed (HLTAID001) every 12 months.

Course Outline:

This course covers, in addition to the topics covered in the Provide First Aid course, the following:

- Planning and preparing
- Managing the remote situation
- Prolonged care of casualties and self
- Infection control in remote situations
- Managing the deteriorating casualty
- Triage
- Managing injuries and illness
- Lifting and moving casualties
- Bites and Stings
- Emergency Communications
- Rescue preparation and evacuation

Assessment is through a combination of practical first aid activities and a written test paper. You will be required to demonstrate CPR on a manikin on the floor.

Entry Requirements/Prerequisites

There are no entry requirements or prerequisites to undertake this training.

Course duration

3 Days - Students that have completed Provide First Aid within the previous 12 months may request an exemption from day one of the course.
